## Fire Brigade

Waiatarua Fire Brigade provided first-aid cover for the Waitakere Christmas Festival at Parrs Park before Christmas. Unfortunately bad weather meant that the event wasn't well attended.

The new vehicle is now in operation, thanks to the Waitakere Licensing Trust.

Cinnamon Edwards and Andy Holyer started their Basic Fire-fighting course at Mt Wellington Training Centre January 2005. NZ Fire Service block courses have changed in the last twelve months. Previously a combination of training and assessment, there is now some theory with the rest being assessment - so more of the training is done on station.

The Brigade is compiling a "wish list" for an application to the Licensing Trust early next year - a winch for the new vehicle, portable radios and first aid gear are on the list so far.

- 3:00 pm, Sat 18 Dec - Power lines down, North Piha. Sorted by Piha brigade.
- 9:27 pm, Sat 18 Dec - Medical assistance, North Way.
- 5:50 pm, Sun 26 Dec - Rubbish fire, West Coast Rd.
- 3:03 pm, Sun 2 Jan - False alarm, West Coast Rd.
- 10:59 pm, Fri 14<sup>th</sup> Jan - Car accident at North Piha. Three people injured, with one going to hospital via helicopter.

Waiatarua Volunteer Fire Brigade attended 71 calls in 2004, a slightly higher figure than usual.

## Roadwatch Report.

SPEED and inadequate driving skills are yet again to blame for two pre-Xmas incidents on West Coast Road. On Sunday the 21st of November, a driver lost control of his car on the series of sharp bends adjacent to the 700's on West Coast Road. The speed was obviously high, the conditions were wet and (yet again) involved an area where we need the "ripples" repaired on the road surface.

On Monday the 29th of November at exactly the same place, speed was the main contributing factor for this driver losing control and smashing into a parked vehicle which was completely off the road. The driver stated he 'hit a kerb type bump and lost control'.

This may sound funny but instead of a vehicle being there, it could have been our children waiting for the school bus - they would undoubtedly have been killed!

I would like to call these accidents, but they are not. Both incidents (or crashes) are due to lack of motoring skills and we need to push home the importance of driving carefully in our Waitakeres.

## Wesley Spragg

*Summarised from R.F.Spragg's paper, 1991*

At the top of Mountain Road up a steep hill from Henderson Valley lies Spragg Bush. The area on the north side was once owned by Wesley Spragg, and comprises Allotments 112 plus parts of 185, 110 and 7A in the Parish of Waipareira.

Wesley was born in Madeley, Shropshire to Charles Spragg (butcher) and his wife Mary. The family of six arrived in Auckland January 1864 on the 'Ulcoats', a White Star iron barque of 671 tons. She made the trip from London in 115 days.

In 1883 Wesley's occupation was given as 'grocer'. In 1886 he established the NZ Dairy Association in partnership with Lovell & Christmas (London merchants). This successful business was sold in 1901 to the dairy farmers as a cooperative concern, Spragg being appointed manager. He retired in 1915.

Wesley Spragg was a wealthy man with a large home and ten acres of land in Mt. Albert when he purchased the Waitakere property in 1901 as a holiday home. He called it "Whare-o-te-Rangi, usually shortened to "Worry-o".

Opposite Wesley's house was (and still is) the two-storey house with a tower, once holiday home to George Fowlds - minister of education in Ward's government before the First World War.

By 1920 Spragg was into his 70's and concerned that after his time the bush at Whare-o-te-Rangi might be destroyed, so decided it should be given to the City of Auckland.

By 1924 the boundary of the park had been cleared and surveyed; then on the 9<sup>th</sup> of April that year Spragg's Bush was formerly handed over to the Mayor, councillors and citizens of Auckland.

The 1930's brought the Great Depression, and the 40's World War II. Wesley's children and grand-children continued to use the old house for holiday weekends etc..

In 1958 the two front rooms and a portion of the roof were destroyed by fire. In 1977 a new building was erected, but this in turn was burnt down in 1986. The third house on the site was built in 1990.

Nowadays many of the surrounding property landowners are continuing to preserve the native growth on their own land, and the nearby bush is as Wesley Spragg and those before him left it. He would no doubt be pleased with the state of the area, although might be surprised by the morning and evening traffic up that way.

## Lightning strike

Local resident John King and his wife Nicky received a bit of a shock recently, during one of those awful summer thunderstorms in the Waitakeres.

Their home, a renovated older model, was struck by fork lightning which lit up their stainless steel kitchen bench like a beacon. A second target was their treasured banana palm in the front garden.

John explained that they quickly acquired what was needed to prevent a repeat episode, and \$300 later feel much safer.

Perhaps other residents may want to check with their electricians that their abodes have what is necessary.
