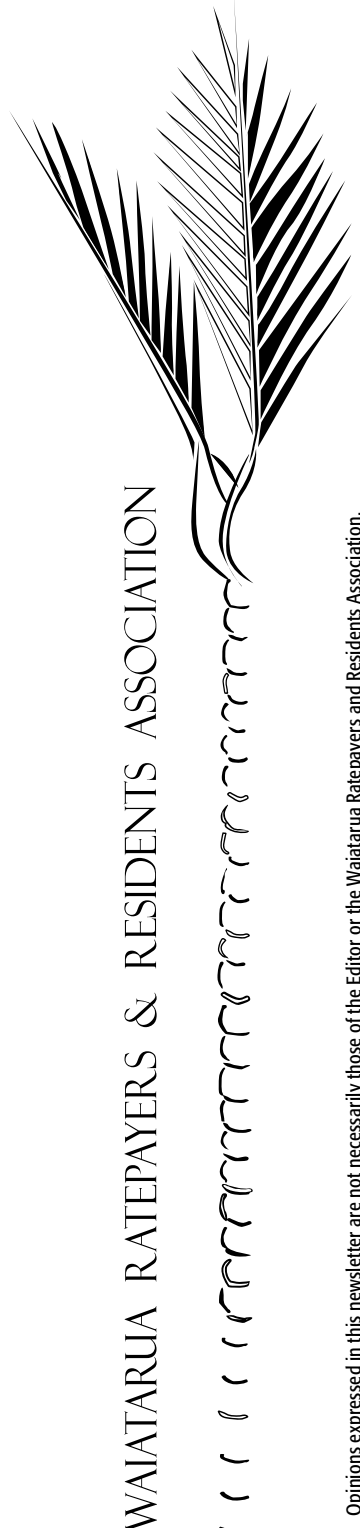

We hope everyone has enjoyed the spectacular summer weather, and is looking forward to another year of fun learning through play. This year is a very special year for Playcentre as an organisation, because it turns sixty years old this year. The whole country will be celebrating by "taking small steps to effect change" which means we will be looking at our impact on the environment.

We are very happy with our own centre surroundings; the new outdoor playground has been well used. The special matting is extra safe for small children to play on and around the swings and other climbing equipment. We now have a ladder and a climbing wall for children to climb up onto the deck. The curved tunnel slide has been a hit, and is large enough for a few adults to test it out.

We have a young group here with many in the small ages and a few babies on the way. About half our families make the drive over the ranges from Piha and Karekare, with the rest coming from nearby Waiaatarua, Oratia and further afield. We are open three mornings a week (Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays) and all the sessions are vibrant and full of enthusiastic children and parents. Fire Brigade

The Auckland Regional Council is now enforcing new legislation concerning outdoor fires. The NZ Fire Service has been working in partnership with the ARC and local territorial authorities to ensure a uniform policy is adopted across the Region. The new guidelines we have seen effectively prohibit open fires (except cooking fires) in urban areas and – apparently – the 'urban' parts of rural areas like Waiatarua. The best advice we can give is that if you want an open fire, you will still need a permit from the Council. Call the WCC helpline on 839 0400 at least 3 working days beforehand to arrange this. They will be able to let you know what is and isn't allowed. If you see any fire which is potentially endangering lives, property or the bush, is a hazard (e.g. smoke reducing visibility to traffic) or a nuisance then you should still phone 111 and ask for the Fire Service.

5:06pm, Sun 9 Dec – Car crash, Piha Rd. The driver of the only vehicle received minor injuries.

5:40pm, Tue 18 Dec – Car crash, Bethells Rd. Two people received treatment after their car left the road.

3:19pm, Sun 23 Dec – Car crash, Piha Rd. One driver was flown to hospital by the Westpac rescue helicopter after a head-on crash. Her injuries were fairly serious but not life-threatening. The road was closed for nearly two hours.

From the Community Board Chair

Your chairman, Dave, asked me for an update on my first two months as Community Board Chairman. Well at the moment I am sitting in Capitola, California watching my baby granddaughter sleeping so it is a good time to reflect.

I was pleasantly surprised to top the poll but disappointed that hardworking colleagues were not returned. No reflection on the new members, they are getting stuck in and have the best interests of the Waitakeres at heart and it is good to have Liz Francke on board with her experience in Titirangi, which has now joined our ward.

[The Chairmanship]... came at a very busy time of the school year. On top of that I suddenly had a whole lot of extra meetings. It has been a frantic time only easing up a bit when I got on the plane – I did take my laptop. I was really running to catch up. I had a lot of good help from my predecessor, Christine, experienced Henderson Chairman, Elizabeth Grimmer, and of course Deputy Mayor, Penny Hulse, whose open door policy has really helped me.

My aim as Chairman is to be a team leader. We are lucky to have 14 (possibly more according to rumour) ratepayer groups in our ward. [W]e have divided the ward up with each member being directly responsible for an area as close as possible to their homes. I have asked each member to keep in close contact with their ratepayer groups and to attend as many of their meetings as possible. Waiatarua is one of 'my' groups and although lately I haven't had much success making the meetings, Dave keeps in touch and knows I will do my best to support Waiatarua in what it needs.

I hope that as people see that the ratepayer groups have a major role in informing Community Board actions the groups themselves will be strengthened. Individuals who have an individual problem are, of course still welcome to contact a Board Member. On some major issues more direct consultation may need to be carried out in conjunction with the local ratepayer groups.

My undertaking to the ratepayers of our ward is that if for some reason we need to do something that goes against local opinion we, or at least I, will come to a community meeting to explain why. All in all I am enjoying the challenge of my new position. I hope that the residents of Waitakere Ward will make the most of their Board.

When Dave Pocock asked me to write about my experience of being Deputy Mayor I wondered if 2 months in the role qualified me to comment in a useful way, but here goes.

The role is made more challenging as the Deputy Mayor is chosen by the councillors. Being nominated by one's peers certainly adds an extra layer of expectation and accountability but I have to say that the last 2 months have been amongst the most rewarding I have experienced.

I have really enjoyed my role as a Councillor and prior to that as a Community Board member and have learnt so much from the community. I am still chairing the Policy and Strategy committee and of course am still a Waitakere ward Councillor, I think the Deputy Mayoralty wraps neatly around these roles.

So what am I expected to do?

At one level I work closely with Bob Harvey supporting his role when he is not able to attend engagements. This is a mixed blessing; I have had the chance to do some lovely things like hosting the celebration for couples married for over 50 years but I am keenly aware that people are always a bit disappointed that Bob isn't there. I feel a little like a slightly short stunt double, but I do enjoy that part of the role and Bob certainly is an inspirational and energetic man, and a lot of fun to work with.

Bob has roles that put him out on the wider national stage so I need to focus on things 'back at the ranch'. My role is to keep a close focus on the day to day work of council to make sure that my colleagues are kept in the loop, and that they have opportunities to participate fully, which ensures that we get the best out of all our elected members.

We have a good range of skills around the council table and my role involves being a listening ear for all elected members to ensure they are well supported in their roles. This is an aspect of my job I particularly enjoy.

I have found that my office is a bit like a GPs waiting room; busy and with a huge variety of people waiting to see me for all sorts of reasons. Staff, fellow elected members and community people who have just dropped in to talk over issues of concern keep my day pretty full. I feel very privileged to be in the position to facilitate solutions to the problems raised with me.

We have some big challenges facing us this year and one of the biggest is the Royal Commission review into Auckland governance. Waitakere has a fantastic reputation as a city that is achieving great things and pushing a sustainable approach to running a city. We have achieved international recognition and we are making progress economically, Henderson is now one of the hottest suburbs to invest in according to the Herald. I don't think that amalgamating all the Cities into one super city will benefit us in any way. There are however opportunities for some amalgamation of regional activities that can save money, and make things work more smoothly. We will certainly be promoting these.

I am working very hard with our staff on our presentations to the Commission that will explain our strengths and our unique community and will be coming out to the community to about how you can all be involved in this discussion and submission process. I believe that if we all work together to present a united front to the Commission we can give them an idea of just what a wonderful community we are and share our ideas for strengthening community governance in the region.

So Waiatarua please "come up and see me some time". If you are at Council or in Henderson, I'd love to see you.
